SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Substance Use Evaluation
- Care plans to address the following needs: substance use, child welfare involvement, housing and financial stability, criminal justice involvement, health/wellness of the parent, high risk pregnancy, and safe parenting
- Team staffing with our Board Certified Addictionologist to determine appropriate recommendations based on the individual's unique needs/circumstances
- Referrals to treatment for substance use & other needs
- Care coordination for substance use, child welfare, criminal justice, economic stability, and medical/mental health care
- Group and individual support with Certified Recovery Peer Specialists
- Evidence-based parenting to include Circle of Security Parenting
- Ages and Stages developmental screenings for babies
- Pre- and post-partum depression inventory

The Women and Family Intervention Services program includes three recovery-oriented system of care (ROSC) components:

1. Family Intervention Services (FIS), which provides the tools for parents to develop substance-free lifestyles and strong family relationships.
2. Women's Intervention Services and Education (WISE), which assists pregnant and parenting women to ensure healthy moms, pregnancy, and children.
3. WISE Substance Exposed Newborn/Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (WISE-SEN), which supports families experiencing, or at risk for, SEN/NAS.
